With the COVID pandemic we have experienced a larger gap in student performance with periods of remote learning and lack of engagment from at risk students. The summer program would be for selected student in grades K through 8 who need additional support with Reading and Math. Our hope is students will be able to close their learning gaps prior to the start of the 2021-2022 school year

STAR and the other above criteria, we will be adminstering a pre-assessment prior to the end of the school year to determine specific reading skills and then will later administer a post assessment ot measure growth

For elementary students, this will be done with the DRA to determine deficits in decoding, fluency and/or comprehension

For middle school students, this will be done with reading passages that target common core priority standards.

* Measurable Results - Defining Success

Each grade level would have around 15 students invited for the summer programing For primary level students: on the DRA students who attend all four weeks of summer school would grow a minimum of two DRA levels.

For middle school students: students who attend all four weeks of the summer programing will show a minimum of 50 point growth on the STAR reading assessment

* Available Technology

We currently have 1:1 chromebooks for students and SMART boards in each classroom. In software, we utilize Freckle to provide targeted reading practice on preassessed skills. At the elementary, students additionally work in Lexia.

The summer programing in Brooklyn is a new addition to our budgeting. Being a small, rural community each year we struggle to account for all needs in our school budget and often have to cut non-essential programing beyond the school day.

If awarded, the \$3,000 would be spent on securing staff for this program. With this dollar amount we would be able to fund one of our instructor positions for the duration of the program. This would minimally allow for 15 students to have access to targeted reading instruction and enrichment for the month of July.
